The Art department attended the Fourth Plinth Schools Award ceremony on Wednesday 3rd May at City Hall. Charlotte, this year's Havering Borough winner and Jess attended together with their parents. It was a wonderful day seeing all the budding artists together with their teachers who have worked tirelessly to nurture creativity in their respective schools.

The competition was launched in 2007 by the Mayor of London's office. The annual awards invites children from primary and secondary schools in the 33 London boroughs to enter a competition in which they create their own art works inspired by the commissions for the Fourth Plinth.

The awards was hosted by Andria Zafirakou, winner of the 2018 Global Teacher Prize, and Justine Simons OBE, Deputy Mayor for Culture and the Creative Industries.
