## Jack Petchey

The Jack Petchey Foundation was established in 1999 to support young people aged 11-25 through programmes in schools and youth organisations. The aim of the charity is to support projects which enable young people to achieve their potential and contribute to society. Pupils can win a Jack Petchey Award for many reasons. Winners receive £300 to spend in school on something that will benefit the pupils. This could be some extra equipment, a trip, money towards an extracurricular club, etc. They also receive a framed certificate and a Jack Petchey Medallion. Plus they are invited to attend the annual Awards evening at the Queen's Theatre.

This half term we had the honour of awarding three Jack Petchey Awards: Our September winner was Ray N, a Year 7 who was nominated for exceeding expectations in the way he has settled into secondary school. Our October winner was Sam W, a Year 11 who shows an incredible work ethic and is hardworking, self-motivated and consistent in his approach to his studies. # Wellbeing Ambassador Training

Ambassador training for the Wellbeing committee recently took place. The aim of the training was for pupils to be able to identify what their role includes and to also plan for the rest of the academic year.

Halle M, a pupil in Year 11, shares her recent training experience – she says:

"On the 16<sup>th</sup> November, Wellbeing ambassadors aged from 11-16 took part in training from Mr Leech (Crusaiders first aid). We learnt about how to be a good Wellbeing ambassador and what we should do to make pupils wellbeing good and stable at Emerson Park. Myself and other Year 11 pupils came up with ideas to try and connect our community at Emerson no matter what age, gender or mental health status. We discussed ideas about how we can improve wellbeing at school and feel strongly that no one should ever have to feel different.

Our aim is to improve Wellbeing at Emerson Park Academy and we're truly passionate about helping and supporting others. This training has really helped us to improve the way we think about Mental Health and the massive stigma. We thank you for supporting us and helping us gain new knowledge."



### Golden Tickets

This half term we launched our exciting new Golden Tickets.

Golden Tickets are awarded to any pupil inside or outside the classroom who have gone 'Above and Beyond' usual expectations. Pupils can be awarded a Golden Ticket for a broad range of reasons from an outstanding piece of work, improved behaviour, an act of kindness, acting responsibly, making a positive contribution to the school community, etc. Each week, all teaching and support staff receive one Golden Ticket which can be awarded at any point during the week. The pupil posts their ticket in the Golden Post Box and waits to see if they are the lucky winner of a £30 Amazon voucher at the end of the week. So far, over 300 tickets have been awarded for a variety of reasons and £120 in prizes have been claimed! Congratulations to all our Golden Ticket winners – we are very proud of all your achievements!



### Men's Health

This month, the Wellbeing committee focused on Men's Health – in particular, Men's Mental Health.

At the beginning of November all pupils had a form activity based on the charity Movember. Pupils learnt how the charity came about, the importance of raising awareness of Testicular cancer, Prostate cancer and Mental Health and the idea of growing a mo to raise money. We updated the Music Department during the Summer holidays. We have now installed Mac Mini computers, allowing our pupils to use the same software as the Music Industry does. We also partnered with Sontronics, an award-winning UK-based sound engineering company producing high-quality microphones. As a result, we have created a Live Room and Studio. Sontronics also supplied podcasting microphones for every Mac Mini, allowing us to create new schemes of work and clubs such as Podcasting and Music Production. We have also created a DJing and Vocal Room. Practice rooms are now available to book in advance using the signup sheets next to each room. Upcoming events include our Christmas Concert and a DJing competition in the New Year. We are also starting a Brass initiative for 15 pupils in January. The chosen pupils will be loaned a brass instrument and given free group lessons for six weeks.
